MEET THE GOAT GRAZERS OF THE PORTUGUESE BEND RESTORATION PROJECT

PALOS VERDES PENINSULA, March 3, 2011– Join the Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy to meet the hardworking goats at the Portuguese Bend Reserve in Rancho Palos Verdes on Saturday, March 19th from 9:00 am to 11:00 am.

Over 400 goats arrived March 2nd for three weeks to graze non-native weeds near the Peacock Flats and Burma Road trails as part of a 12-acre Conservancy restoration project. The project will eventually turn the weedy hillside into native coastal sage scrub and grassland habitats, supporting threatened and endangered plants and wildlife, such as the California gnatcatcher and cactus wren.

According to Conservation Director Danielle LeFer, *“Through practiced and controlled efforts by biologist and restoration ecologists, grazing is becoming a more commonly used practice by land managers. It is now accepted as a cost-efficient and effective tool for land conservation and to reduce fuel loads in fire-prone areas.”* Fire Grazers, Inc., which worked with the City of Rancho Palos Verdes on brush clearance in July 2010, is working with the Conservancy on this project.

Come visit the goats and learn about this Earth-friendly method of habitat restoration. Meet at 9:00 am at the trail entrance to the Portuguese Bend Reserve on Burrell Lane at the end of Crenshaw Blvd. near Del Cerro Park. Wear comfortable shoes and bring sun protection.
